Notice of a Congregational Vote

A congregational vote has been scheduled for Sunday, November 5th immediately after the service for the purpose of determining the future path of the building committee. While only members of the congregation can vote, all who are part of our faith community are invited to attend and are welcome to be part of the discussion.

After much time and effort the building committee feels that they have arrived at a point where further work should not go forward without the agreement of the congregation that the pursuit of a smaller building on our existing site is the path they should be on. Although the committee firmly believes that such a pursuit is the best option for the future of our congregation, they realize that the decision is not theirs alone to make.

A letter has been sent out with information and FAQs so that everyone has ample time to consider the arguments before the meeting. If you did not receive a copy contact the church office and they will send or email you one. In the meantime we hope that you will join us in praying for God's help and guidance as we consider how best to continue our mission of wholeness into the future.



Electronic Giving

Thank you for your interest in electronic giving to Disciples Christian Church. The best method you could use to pay DCC electronically is through your own bank's on line bill pay feature. To initiate this you would have to add DCC to your list of payees. You could then establish payments on a regular basis in any amount that you choose. Presently there are several members of DCC who do this and their checks arrive in the mail on a regular basis. This method results in NO COSTS TO DCC. If you need help with establishing on line bill pay, please call us for assistance.

Alternatively, you could utilize the services of VANCO which is available through DCC's website. Funds will be transferred directly from your account to that of DCC. You can choose the frequency, date, amount and where you designate the funds be applied i.e. contributions, hunger fund etc. The fees DCC pays VANCO for this service include:

*A monthly fee of \$5

*35c per transaction (both for the withdrawal from your account and the deposit into DCC's account

*And finally a fee of 2% of the amount donated.

Presently DCC does not accept Credit Cards. Please let Judy Griffith know if you are interested in donating by a Credit Card.

We have been learning some new gathering and communion songs throughout the fall to enhance our community singing and grow our sacred song repertoire. We have had two tremendous community sings and I am looking forward to our final sing on Nov. 18^{th,} held at our very own Disciples Church! Because we are hosting this community sing, I'd like as many of our community members to be there as possible. Sharon Watkins to Lead Major New Initiative With the National Council of Churches

The National Council of Churches is pleased to announce that Rev. Dr. Sharon Watkins, former General Minister and President of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), will be leading a major new emphasis of the Council. Rev. Watkins will be directing a nationwide accounting of how churches and their leaders have been complicit in, and have perpetuated, racism in America.

The National Council of Churches believes that a complete, honest, and exacting truth about racial prejudice and hate has not yet been told. This ambitious project, co-chaired by Jaquelyn Dupont-Walker (African Methodist Episcopal Church) and Rev. John Dorhauer (United Church of Christ), will unfold over a period of years and will involve the 38 member communions of the Council, a community of mainline Protestant, historically African American churches, Orthodox and Peace churches.

"The complicity of the white churches and leaders must be accounted for and acknowledged if we are to begin the process of moving toward healing in this country," says Watkins. "Predominantly white congregations and denominations have been complicit in perpetuating the sin of racism in ways we have not yet fully recognized, and no healing, no justice, no reconciliation can be achieved without a complete telling of the truth." For the past two years, Watkins has served the National Council of Churches as the Chair of the Governing Board. She served as the General Minister and President of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) from 2005 to 2017. She gave the sermon at President Obama's National Prayer Service in 2009 and served a term on the White House Advisory Council for the Office of Faith-Based and Neighborhood Partnerships. She has a lifelong commitment to

Watkins has been succeeded in her term of office at the National Council of Churches by Bishop Darin W. Moore of the AME Zion Church, who begins his term immediately. Watkins is employed as contract staff specifically for this project.

"This is clearly one of the most ambitious, and most important, projects of the National Council of Churches in its history," said General Secretary and President Jim Winkler. "This effort is a clarion call to the conscience of the churches and the soul of America. We have the utmost confidence that Sharon is the right person for this work and for this era of the Council."
